\$137,200 in Scholarships Awarded to the Class of 2022!





A record \$137,200 in scholarships was awarded to the Class of 2022 at the 42nd annual Austin Academic Achievement Awards and RIMEF Scholarship Night.*** Over 500 attended the in-person event held in the Rock Island High School Auditorium. 133 Seniors, Juniors, Sophomores, and Freshmen were honored by RIHS faculty, administration, RIMEF board members, and scholarship benefactors. 87 outstanding RIHS students received certificates of Top Ten recognition along with an "I'm a Top 10" t-shirt and gift cards from Whitey's and the RI Parks & Recreation. 58 deserving students from the Class of 2022 received Departmental Austin Academic Achievement Awards, Academic Excellence Awards, and RIMEF Scholarships. The generosity of 237 AAAA contributors and 37 scholarship benefactors made these awards possible to our deserving RIHS seniors. This evening honoring RIHS students for their academic accomplishments was livestreamed on Facebook and is available for viewing online. The tradition of celebrating and rewarding academic excellence within Rock Island High School and our district will continue thanks to the strong support of all those who believe in our students, teachers, and schools.

Coaches and mentors from throughout the Quad Cities provided their expertise to help lead them through the process from idea to pitch.

Something New, the winner of both *Best Pitch* and the grand prize of *Best Business Model*, was developed by Kezimana Karine. **Something New** is a clothing upcycling enterprise-reinventing unused/older clothing into new and exciting garments & accessories. Winners of Best Business Potential, **Concourse** and **Evolution Gaming** also illustrated the creative, problem-solving teamwork within the seventh-year INCubator class.

Nell's family established this scholarship to honor them and their dedication to learning. The scholarship is given to 4 students pursuing a degree in education. Award: \$2,500 (each)
