RIMEF Celebrates Academic Excellence!

Rock Island High School Seniors, Juniors, Sophomores, and Freshmen were honored and awarded for academic excellence through this year's 41st Annual *Austin Academic Achievement Awards and RIMEF Scholarships*. 95 RIHS students were given Top Ten recognition and 43 from the Class of 2021 received \$93,300 in Austin Academic Achievement Awards and RIMEF Scholarships. Without the generosity of 237 AAAA contributors and 37 scholarship benefactors, these awards to our deserving RIHS seniors would not have been possible. The event recognizing 128 RIHS students for their academic accomplishments was livestreamed on Facebook and is available for viewing online. Heart of a "Rock" Scholarship

Megan Wilson and Triona Roberts, 2010 RIHS graduates, established this scholarship in honor and memory of their mothers (Terri Wilson and Yolanda Roberts) who both fought a battle with breast cancer. The intention is to support seniors who have undergone the unforeseen challenges that happen when parents are fighting illnesses. The award is given to one special student with a heart of a "rock" who has/had a parent with an illness of any kind. The scholarship was established with donations from Ms. Wilson and Ms. Roberts along with donations from friends, family, and community members. Award: \$1,000

Mollie Montgomery Scholarship

Mollie Montgomery was an active community member who left a large bequest to the Education Foundation in 2008. In her honor, the RIMEF has initiated the Mollie Montgomery Scholarship. This award benefits a student pursuing any field of medicine - Nursing, Pre-Med, CNA, Medical Research, etc. Criteria also includes providing a history of service to community, non-profit, or school organizations as a regular volunteer. Award: \$2,000.



Miles W. Rich Family Scholarship

Miles Rich established this scholarship in honor of his long-established Rock Island family. This 4-year scholarship is awarded to a student who will major in Business Administration at a public college or university. The recipient must maintain a GPA of 2.5 or better each year. Award: \$4,000 – paid as \$1,000 per year for 4 years.

Rock Island Rotary "Service Above Self" Scholarship



The Rotary Club of Rock Island established this scholarship to encourage "Service Above Self," the principal motto of Rotary International. Student must demonstrate how they aid family, friends, colleagues, and/or the community. Using "Service Above Self" as a theme, student must submit an essay demonstrating how they incorporate Rotary's 4-Way Test into their daily lives: 1. Is it the Truth? 2. Is it fair to all concerned? 3. Will it build goodwill and better friendships? 4. Will it be beneficial to all concerned? A written recommendation must come from a teacher or staff person who can speak to the student's devotion to helping others. Preference is given to a student with a GPA of 2.5 or above. Award: \$1,000.

Rosemary Woodward Scholarship

Rosemary Woodward devoted her life to ensuring the health and well-being of children and adults through her career as a nurse and volunteer work. Funded by a grant from her endowment with the RI Community Foundation, the RIMEF established this scholarship to honor her career both as a nurse and her many years of volunteering. Applicants may have taken CNA or biology/health courses while in high school, volunteered at nursing homes/hospitals, or have a family member with chronic health issues but their intended major, degree, certificate must be within the field of nursing or as a CNA. Award: \$1,000.

The *Final Pitch Night* for the INCubator.edu: Entrepreneurship and Enterprise Class was held on Wednesday, May 12 in the RIHS Auditorium. Five outstanding teams "pitched" their business ideas to classmates and a select panel of judges from the Quad Cities business community. Very little separated the scores of the top three presenting teams and thanks to the generosity of donors Mark & Elizabeth Thies, the judges and the RIMEF were able to give a cash prize to each. A total of \$10,000 was awarded: \$2,500 each to *Best Pitch*, **Boardable** and *Best Business Potential*, **Pooh Pods** and the top prize of \$5,000 to the *Best Business Model*, **The Cobblers**.

Students from this sixth year of the INCubator.edu class spent much of their classwork time learning virtually. Mrs. Patricia Matson led the students through online/remote and some live classroom instruction as they formed teams and developed their concepts into viable businesses. For the *Academic First Pitches* on May 3rd and 6th, a record 14 teams showcased their businesses with some teams giving live presentations and some presenting through Google Meets. Judges who viewed the Academic Pitches both live and remotely scored and selected the final 5 teams to move on to the *Final Pitch*.

The RIMEF would like to thank all of the judges who gave their time and shared their business expertise with the INCubator.edu students. We'd also like to thank Rock Island Rotary for its continued support of the program and Mr. & Mrs. Thies for providing the award money which can be used as start-up funds or taken as scholarships. With the support of our donors, the RIMEF pays the ongoing costs of the INCubator.edu curriculum and training as well as funding seed-money to develop the teams' websites, prototypes, etc. during the school year.
