A Night to Celebrate!

The Austin Academic Achievement Awards and RIMEF Scholarship Night is an evening awarding the academic excellence at Rock Island High School. This year, 134 students were celebrated at the event held on May 8 in the RIHS Auditorium. 74 Top Ten students were recognized for their academic success and 70 deserving seniors of the Class of 2024 were awarded scholarships. 20 Austin Academic Achievement Award Departmental scholarships totaling

\$35,000 were presented. The 1st and 2nd place AAAA recipients were selected by the teachers within the 10 academic areas. The moving and sometimes entertaining nominations for the students were read by representative faculty. These scholarships are funded through our appeal sent in March along with donations received throughout the year. \$142,200 in RIMEF Named scholarships were then awarded. Several scholarship benefactors presented the award they had established making for a very memorable evening. The night concluded with a lovely reception in the RIHS "Island." This wonderful event was attended by a full house of parents/caretakers, families, RIHS faculty/administration, members of the RIMSD board, and the RIMEF board/committee members.

The evening and awards for our outstanding RIHS students were made possible through the generosity of nearly 170 AAAA contributors and 49 scholarship benefactors. This tradition of celebrating and awarding academic excellence within Rock Island High School and our district will continue thanks to the strong support of all those who believe in the students, teachers, and schools of the Rock Island-Milan School District.

New Scholarships



The Troy H. Ellis Scholarship

Troy Ellis was a 1987 graduate of RIHS where he lettered as a 4-year member of the golf team. Troy graduated from the U. of Iowa and U of Missouri-Kansas City School of Law. He became a successful attorney and remained an avid golfer throughout his life.

The Troy H. Ellis Scholarship was

established by Troy's family and friends in honor of Troy and his love of golf. The recipient must have a GPA of 3.0-4.0, minimum of 2 years on the RIHS golf team, and a personal letter stating why they love golf, and the life lessons it has taught them. The annual scholarship award amount is \$1,500.



The Steven and Mabel M. Velge Track & Cross-Country Scholarship

Mabel Velge established this scholarship in memory of her son Steven - a member of the Class of 1969. Mabel started running at 55 and her love of the sport continued throughout her long life. She was a member of the Cornbelt Running

Club and ran dozens of marathons here and across the US. Two scholarships will be awarded - one to a female and one to a male who are members of Rocky's track or cross-country teams at the varsity level. A letter of recommendation must come from the track or cross-country coach. Each student receives a scholarship in the amount of \$6,000.

On May 15, five outstanding teams from the 2023-2024 RIHS INCubator.edu class presented their business pitches before a public audience in the Rocky Auditorium. The five teams advanced from the Academic Pitch held on May 8 when all INCubator.edu teams presented. The pitches were evaluated/scored by a panel of judges from the academic and business communities. The five presenting teams were: *ATS (Automatic Turn Signal), CloudSerts, QCFashion, Swaver,* and *Take Over. Swaver* was named "Best Business Model" and "Best Business Potential" and was awarded

\$5,000 for their team. QCFashion was given the "Best Pitch" and received \$2,500. Both teams can use their prizes as seed money for their businesses or evenly divide their winnings for scholarship awards.

Donors Making a Difference - Darrell and Mary Anne Reynolds



Darrell and Mary Anne Reynolds have made support of education and community their mission. Darrell, RIHS Class of 1965, and Mary Anne, Alleman Class of 1965, have provided for programs, projects, classrooms, and families throughout our area. You would be hard-pressed to find a Rock Island-Milan student who has not benefitted from the Reynolds's generosity. They currently fund two of our named scholarships, the Bright Ideas Awards (see below), the Reynolds Returning Rocks program, and have paid for numerous special projects or needs within our class-

rooms and schools. The Reynolds believe that if a project impacts children, it's a way to give back to the community and improve the quality of life.

Darrell and Mary Anne don't seek the spotlight unless their giving motivates others to give as well. Darrell frequently sends quotes emphasizing the importance of giving to children, thank you memes: "Teachers don't teach for the income, they teach for the outcome" and emails with stories such as:

There once was a man vacationing on the coast of Mexico. One evening, he decided to take a midnight stroll down the deserted beach. There was a full moon and down the beach he could make out a boy who would scurry around, pick up something and throw it back into the ocean. As the man drew closer to the boy, he could the beach was littered with starfish. As he reached the boy, he asked what he was doing. The boy explained that with each full moon the tide would wash the starfish so far up on the beach that they were destined to die the next day in the sun.

The man responded that there must be thousands of miles of beach and millions of stranded starfish. How much difference did this one boy hope to make?

The boy pondered the question for a moment, looked back at the starfish in his hand and tossed it as hard as he could back into the life-giving sea and answered, "It made a difference to that one."

Darrell continued this email with — So when asked to support the Rock Island-Milan Education Foundation, maybe think about this story and know if you make a contribution, you made a difference in the life of a student and a young mind.

Darrell retired as owner and CEO of Eriksen Chevrolet-Buick in Milan eight years ago allowing he and Mary Anne to enjoy more time with their kids and grandkids. They stay involved with various organizations they have been with over the years, but they are focus on time with the family.
